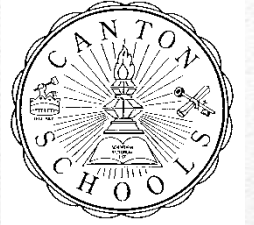

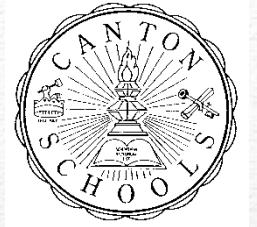
New This Year



- Revised SAT launched March 2016
 - CT “School Day”: March 2, 2016
 - Two sections: ERW (ELA), Math
 - Two additional test dates: May/June 2016
 - Three sections: ERW (ELA), Math, Writing (optional)
 - Two sets of data:
 - Class of 2016: Old SAT dates 9/2015-1/2016
 - Class of 2017: New SAT

Class of 2016: Overall

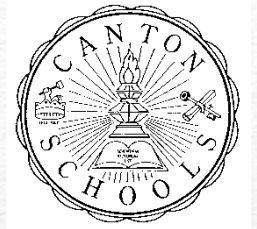

State (all students)	520	502	ELA= 65% M = 39%

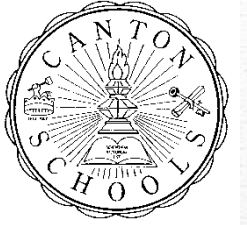

All Canton Test Dates



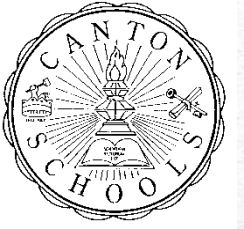

PSAT to SAT Correlation

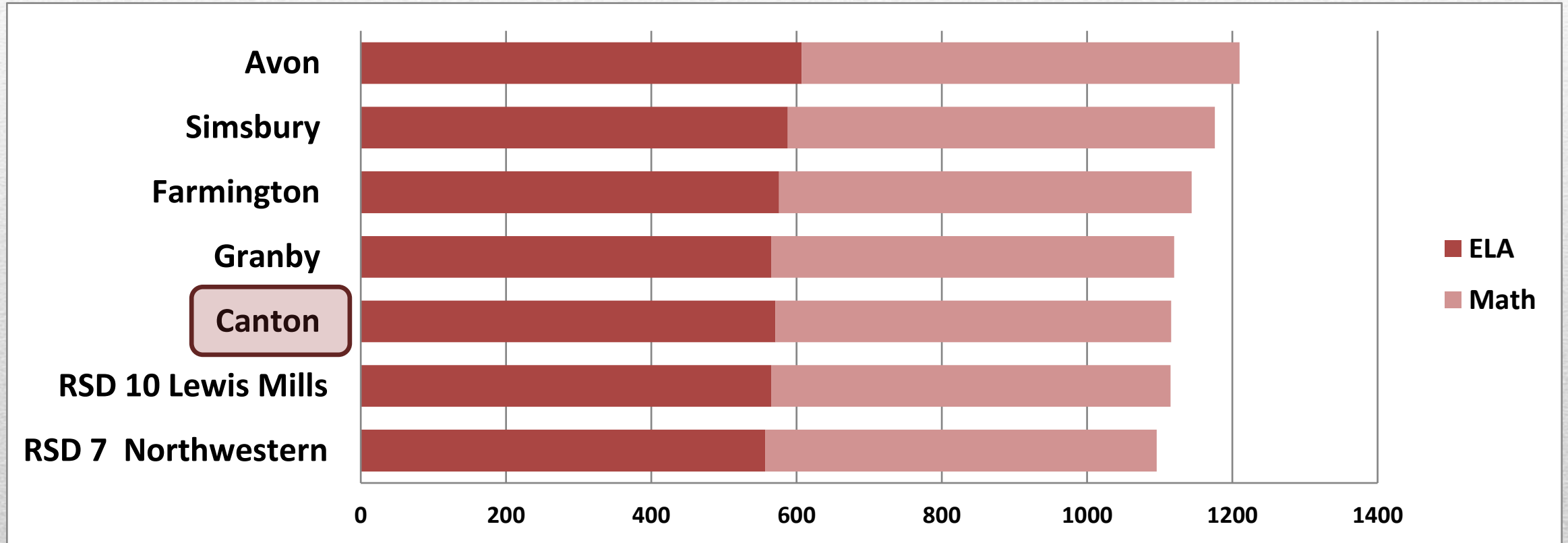

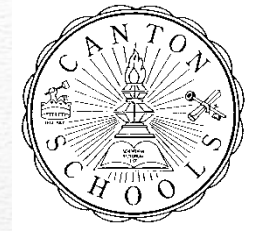
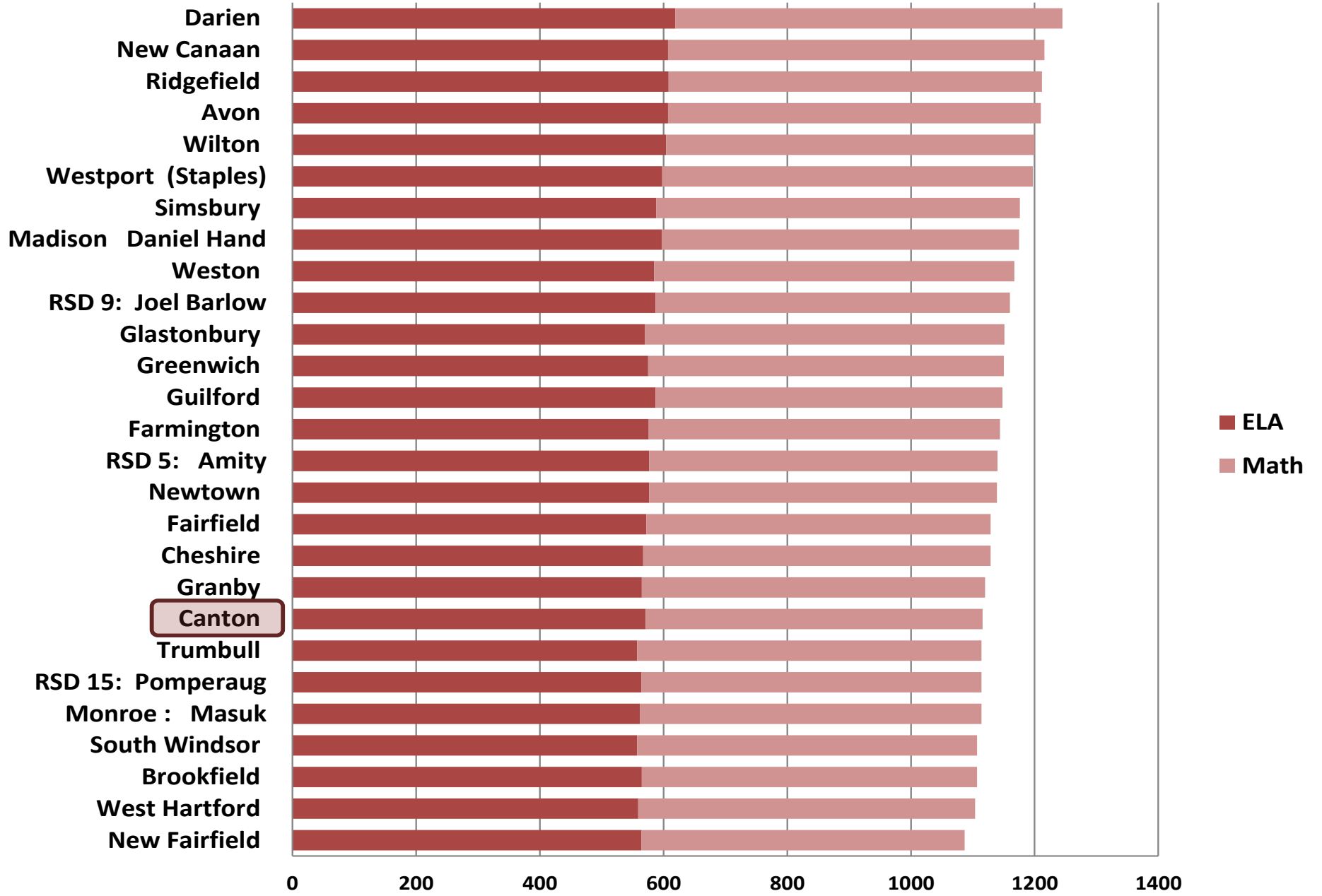
March 2016 Scores, Contiguous Districts Varying District Reference Groups (DRGs)



March 2016 Scores: DRG C

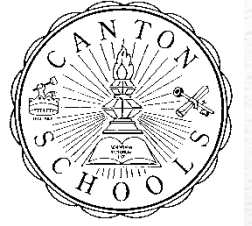

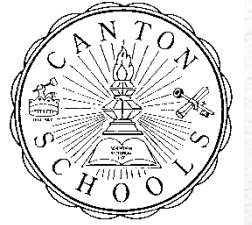

What Are Colleges Saying?



- Students should be aware of “score inflation”
 - Colleges will recalculate; roughly:
 - A new 1200 corresponds to an old 1130.
 - A new 1300 corresponds to an old 1230.
 - A new 1400 corresponds to an old 1340.
 - A new 1500 corresponds to an old 1460.
 - *But* a new 1600 is just as perfect as an old 1600.
 - Most colleges may no longer consider the essay
 - ACT vs. SAT: who will drop the writing first?

From the College Board...



- Math section to become “less wordy.”
 - “Superfluous words are superfluous” –David Coleman, CollegeBoard CEO
 - Continued investigation of fraud, recycled tests
