CALL TO ORDER – Chair Daniels called the September 9, 2025 meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE** – Jonathan Ho led the Pledge of Allegiance

PUBLIC COMMENT

Ryan Colgan of 7 Buttonwood Hill Rd. - I want to emphasize that a Title 9 inquiry and investigation is a very serious matter. The US Department of Education's Office for Civil Rights have already found that Canton, along with other districts, violated Title 9 by denying athletic opportunities to female student athletes. These findings specifically included cases where biological males competed in girls' sports creating clear disadvantages for female athletes. For me personally, this is not abstract. My daughter is directly affected, canton school system. Currently offers a freshman boys soccer program but does not provide an equivalent girls team. This inequity was cited in the OCR findings and given that soccer is the largest youth sport in Canton, it cannot be explained away as a lack of participation. I want to know why this disparity exists and how it will be addressed. With the introduction of our new athletic director, I believe it is important to hear his stance on the issue as well. Specifically, whether he supports allowing biological male athletes to participate in girl's competitive sports. This is at the heart of the OCR findings and it's at the heart of fairness for our daughters. Transparency - the community deserves clarity on how the board is handling this. Since this is a municipal election year, it should be on the public record when and which board members voted in favor of using taxpayer dollars to push back on the OCR's resolution terms instead of working towards compliance. In addition, I urge the board to create either a public O&A session or a published FAO on the BOE website so families can access factual information about what is at stake, including the potential loss of hundreds of thousands of dollars in federal funding. This is more about legal compliance as it is ensuring equal opportunity for all Canton students protecting fairness and athletics and maintaining transparency and trust with taxpayers. Thank you.

Jean Mix - 33 Garrett Rd. - I just wanted to comment about the memo that was sent out by the Canton Public schools and they stated I quote- "our teams would no longer be eligible to and to participate in league games, conference championships, or state tournaments. Student athletes would lose valuable opportunities for competition, exposure, scholarships and school spirit through no fault of their own. Wouldn't this be terrible for any one student to have to go through, let alone all the athletes at Canton. Wouldn't you agree?" Well, one of our own did and has already gone through this. The biological female Canton student was not able to participate in competitions, conference championships and state tournaments due to the participation of two transgender females, or males identifying as transgender females. The female student, our own Canton child, lost valuable opportunities for competition. 25 different races were lost,

exposure at state and regional tournaments, scholarships she lost out of and she did not get to participate in school spirit of seeing the banner raised in the gym by no fault of her own. This is exactly what happened to this particular student that canton. Her rights to have protection under Title 9, were not protected by Canton, the CIAC or the state of Connecticut. What we have here is a conflict of rights where one person's rights appear to be upheld at the expense of another. Canton has been negligent for five years by not protecting the rights of biological females. Instead of being on the forefront of coming up with solutions, our Superintendent, our Board of Education and administration have said we don't care about our biological female students. So, our Superintendent, Board of Ed and administration have said we do not care about our biological students and biological females. And biological females should just sit down and be quiet. You have failed us. Every student counts. Every student matters, including biological females. Thank you.

ADMINISTRATIVE REPORTS

Board of Education Chair, L. Daniels welcomed everyone to the meeting and introduced the Jonathan Ho, the Board of Education's Junior student Representative and our new Board Member, Michelle Kulak. L. Daniels shared a summer update. Dr. Grossman, Superintendent of Schools introduced Brian Gouin, the district's new Athletic Director and Supervisor of Health & Physical Education. He shared summer updates and upcoming events such as open house schedules and board meetings.

Student Representatives J. Ho and L. Mainville shared updates from the four schools – CBPS, CIS, CMS and CHS.

In the absence of the Business Manager, Dr. Grossman reviewed the Financial Memo and July and August Financials. **MOTION: Move that the Canton Board of Education approve the July and August 2025 Financials as presented.** (F. Jordan | E. Hayes; unanimous)

NEW BUSINESS

Brian Gouin provided a concise introduction and described his new role. Dr. Grossman and L. Daniels commended him on a job well done, even in his short time here, significant improvements have been made and noticed and they look forward to a fall update.

Finance Chair, R. Bush shared that in the Finance Committee meetings, conversations have been held surrounding the food service debt. Debt that is unpaid by families in the district for breakfast and lunch. No action was taken, as the Board needs to have further discussion on the process for debt services.

Board Members provided updates to the meetings that were had for their committees. Some meetings have not happened as the school year has just started. Chair Daniels shared an updated Committee document with the Board – minimal changes but committees had to be reassigned due to the addition of a new Board Member and the removal of another Board Member.

Included in the Board Packets were a copy of the upcoming Board of Education events which consisted of school open houses and upcoming board meeting schedules for walkthroughs and remaining meetings for 2025.
